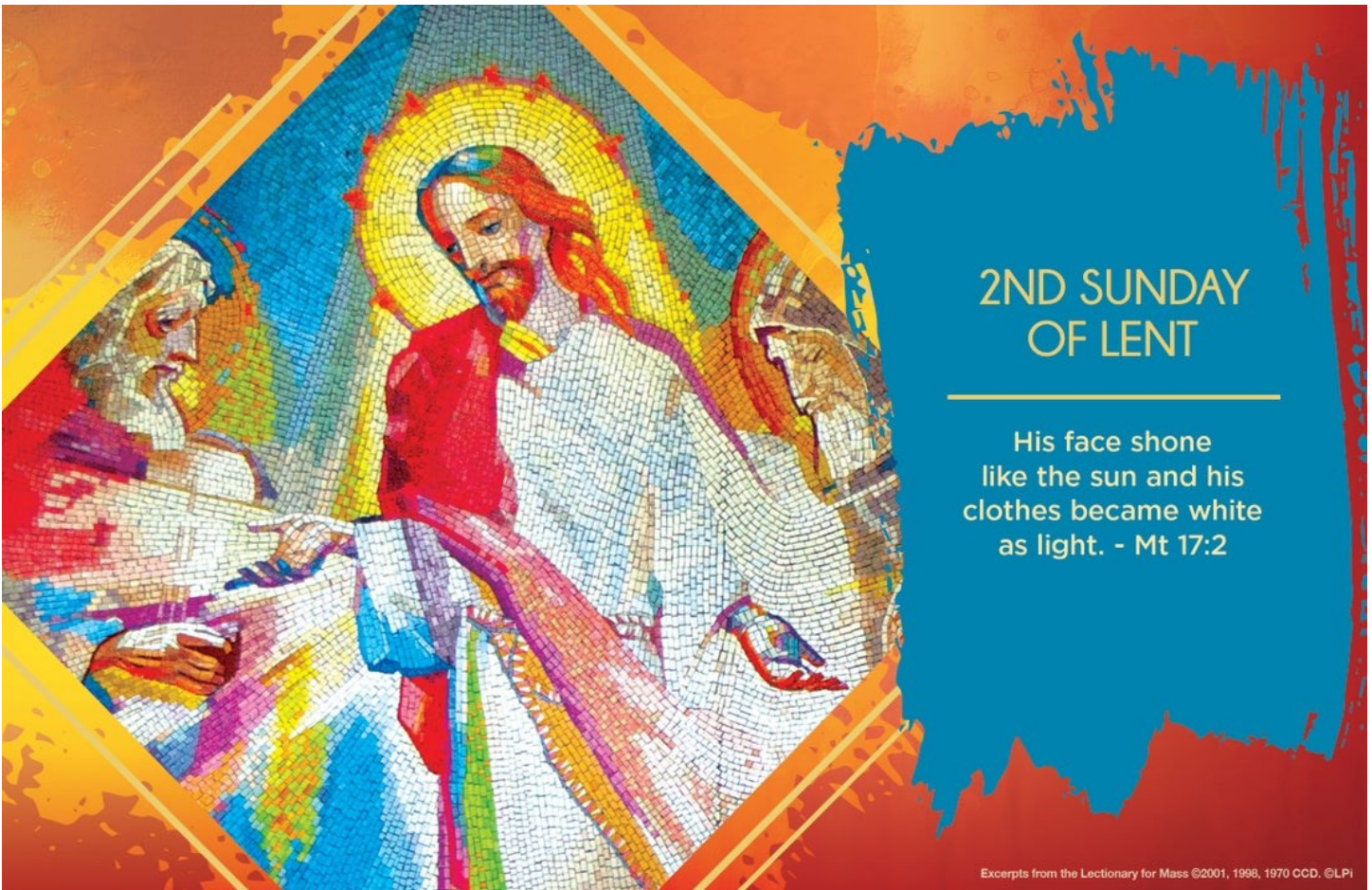

It seems we had between 150 and 200 people who came to celebrate the Sacrament of Penance. Thanks, also, to **Bishop McGovern** for taking several hours of confessions. If that weren't enough for the weekend, we also had the **Rite of Election and Call to Continuing Conversion** on Sunday afternoon: one of the most amazing and positive rituals of the year. Ninety-five people came forward to be recognized by the Bishop as they prepare for the Easter sacraments. Thanks, in particular, to **Deacon Wayne & Josie Weiler** for their assistance in getting things ready for the rite. **Rich Thompson** coordinated some beautiful music for the ritual. - **ABSENCE.** As I previously noted, I'll be away this week, during the week, to offer retreat to the Ursuline Sisters at Maple Mount, Kentucky, outside Owensboro.
