- **HOLY WEEK.** The beautiful celebrations of Holy Week are soon upon us. Please see the schedule in another part of the bulletin. And please make a renewed effort to take part. They are powerfully moving liturgies! Also, since this is my first Holy Week as the director of the Office of Worship for the Diocese, my mind will certainly be a little less focused during Holy Week, except on the liturgies. *Thanks in advance for your patience and prayers!*

- **HOLY COMMUNION FROM THE CHALICE.** Bishop McGovern has announced that parishes are permitted to begin again with distribution of Holy Communion from the Chalice **beginning on Holy Thursday, April 6.** As always, the ministers will use the purificator to wipe the chalice, then they'll turn the chalice a quarter turn so no two people in a row are taking from the same spot. It's up to those who wish to receive to be certain that they have **no communicable disease when receiving** out of respect for everyone else and their good health. While you're welcome to take from the Chalice starting on Holy Thursday, there is never an obligation, except for the priest, to receive in this manner.

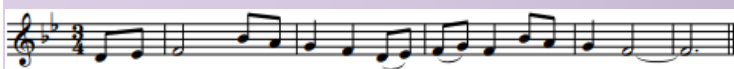

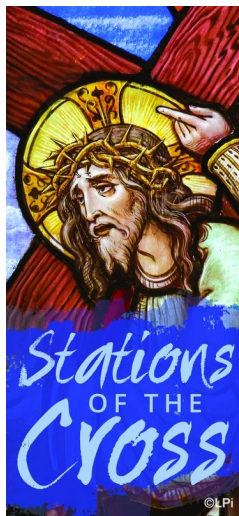
