

## From Fr. Godfrey

- HOSPITALITY. Last weekend, we had a good turnout for the Saturday morning workshop on hospitality, using the book Radical Hospitality. While there were talks, there was also invaluable table conversation (and good food, too!), along with a wonderful mix of age groups represented. HOSPITALITY is the first pillar of

stewardship. While Coffee & Doughnuts is a great outward sign of hospitality, I also reminded everyone that we are hard-wired to be hospitable, since the first seven days of creation are all marked with hospitality: the sea welcoming the land, the vegetation welcoming the animals, and all of it welcoming the first human beings. Hospitality is only possible when our FEARS DISSIPATE. While "strangerdanger" is an appropriate lesson for little children, adults gripped with fear will never be welcoming to the other. Hospitality doesn't just mean space in my house or at my table either, but also space in my thoughts, my prayers, and in my willingness to love. The real challenge of hospitality in a parish revolves around helping others feel welcome, at ease, and in their rightful place (even if they're in "my pew"). Welcoming others isn't always easy for everyone, but it's our task as true Christian disciples. We are also called to welcome Christ. Welcoming Him involves welcoming the least of His brothers and sisters. Welcoming Him means attending to the proclamation of His Word, and helping others hear and understand the readings. Welcoming Christ is also important hospitality. And fundamentally, we are welcoming of others and of Christ because Christ first welcomes us, in baptism, in Holy Communion, in the sacrament of Penance. There is a whole lot of welcoming that needs to be going on. It's every disciple's role to be part of the "hospitality committee." Let's welcome one another, welcome Christ, as we have been welcomed. By the way, more Radical Hospitality books have been ordered and will be in the ramp entrance soon.





## Vocations

"The countless gravestones at Normandy American Cemetery in France stirred my heart. These brave soldiers who sacrificed *their lives challenged me: Would I be willing to lay down my* life, as these men did, for the Lord and his people? Long before this pivotal moment, the seeds of my vocation had been planted by family role models. My grandfather served his family and parish sacrificially for many years after his WWII duty. *Likewise, my father coached me in self-discipline, and my dear* mother raised me to serve others. It was at college that the Lord Jesus truly captured my heart. After graduation, I served as a missionary and met the Brotherhood of Hope. I admired the brothers and their work evangelizing students at secular universities, but I resisted the idea of celibacy and did not have the courage to explore a vocation with them until after my experience at Normandy Beach. My years with the Brothers of Hope have strengthened my conviction that Jesus Christ alone can satisfy our deepest desires."
