From Fr. Godfrey

- **FORMATION.** For the past few weeks, I've been writing about the pillars of stewardship. The first pillar is **hospitality**: habitual welcoming of God, neighbor, and truth in a Christian spirit of love. The second is **prayer**: speaking and listening with God.

The third pillar of stewardship is

formation. Formation is more than the knowledge of trivia or simple facts. Formation is fundamentally *hospitality for the teaching Tradition of the Church*. Formation is the humble stance that two thousand years of tradition may offer something more than I have concluded. Formation is an interest in not only "what I've **heard** the Church teaches," but in what the Church truly teaches. Have I ever looked something up in the Catechism? Am I willing to go to an adult faith formation offering in the parish? Do I realize that the Church's moral teaching has something to say about the tricky decisions I must make at the end of a loved one's life? Do I care that the Church's social teaching calls me to a daily deeper love for neighbor in community, along with conversion away from injustice, including bigotry? The teaching Tradition has certainly developed as our world has developed (there was not a teaching on artificial birth control before artificial birth control came about), but it always remains intimately tied to the gospel example of Jesus. Knowing Jesus involves a love for the Scriptures and a deeper understanding of their application to our own life. Formation means that we can entrust ourselves to others who have studied the Tradition and share it faithfully. The Eternal Potter forms the clay – that's formation. Let's be open and interested in the teachings of the Church not (just) so that we can win Catholic Trivia, but that we might rejoice in the knowledge and love of the Lord.

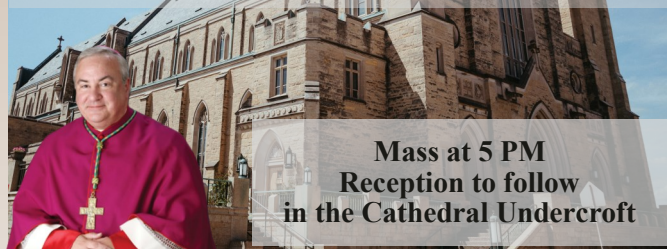
"Growing up, I had a lot of misconceptions about nuns. Primarily, I assumed women became nuns only if they couldn't find a boyfriend.
