From Fr. Godfrey

- **STEWARDSHIP.** Over the past four weeks, I have focused on the four pillars of stewardship: Hospitality, Prayer, Formation, Service in preparation for our Annual Stewardship Renewal. Next weekend, Rob & Greta Stock will give testimony to the importance of stewardship, and then Commitment Sunday is August 26-27. The most effective stewardship renewal engages the greatest number of people. **PLEASE READ THE MAILED**

MATERIALS, PRAY GRATEFULLY, DISCERN YOUR TALENTS, and then MAKE YOUR COMMITMENT. While the parish is always better for the generosity of its members, the members are each better for it too! God has gifted us with time with Him, with talents for the Kingdom, with treasure for building His Reign and expressing our values. The gifted rightly respond with grateful generosity. Whatever you do for the least of these, you do for me (Matt. 25). God loves a cheerful giver. These are all part of the disciple's life of genuine stewardship.

HOLY COMMUNION. Bishop McGovern asked me to write about posture at Holy Communion. Succinctly, there is ambiguity in the rubrics in two documents currently in force (*General Instruction of the Roman Missal* and *Redemptionis Sacramentum*). Starting from the Church's rationale for not offering Holy Communion to those who are not Catholic, unity of belief and posture is of great importance. That priority of unity, reiterated numerous times in liturgical words, demonstrates that personal preference, even if rooted in devotion, is not more important than the unity of the Church. The norm established in the United States by our Bishops: to stand and bow the head before receiving. Personally, when someone kneels for Holy Communion, it compromises my ability to minister for two reasons. First, my eyes. Astigmatism, one eye far-sighted and one near-sighted, slightly cross-eyed, and bifocals. Prism in my glasses helps offset some of this, but looking down and trying to place the host reverently on someone's tongue is particularly difficult for me. Second, I think I have mostly dealt sufficiently with the psychological fallout of the sexual abuse scandals. Still, I am very careful not to place myself in compromising physical positions. When someone kneels directly in front of me, it is, perhaps irrationally, a violation of my personal physical boundaries. That's why I generally step aside when someone kneels to receive. Kneeling for Holy Communion has been part of the custom of the church for centuries – almost always with a wood or marble structure between the priest and the communicant.

Resources for You

-**The Bishop's Library:** located in the far right of the North entrance. Catholic books & films are available to borrow, just return them when finished.

-**Flag Repository:** Need to retire your American Flags? This repository box is just outside the Bishop's Library in the North Nave.

-**Restrooms:** a single handicap restroom is located just inside the ramp entrance, additional restrooms are downstairs through the right door, near the entrance to the Marian chapel.

In the case of weather emergency during Mass, the sacristan will advise the priest of the situation. The priest will then advise the congregants to seek shelter in the Undercroft. The ushers shall assist in directing congregants in seeking shelter. Once it is determined to be safe, congregants will be directed back the nave of the Cathedral or will be dismissed.
