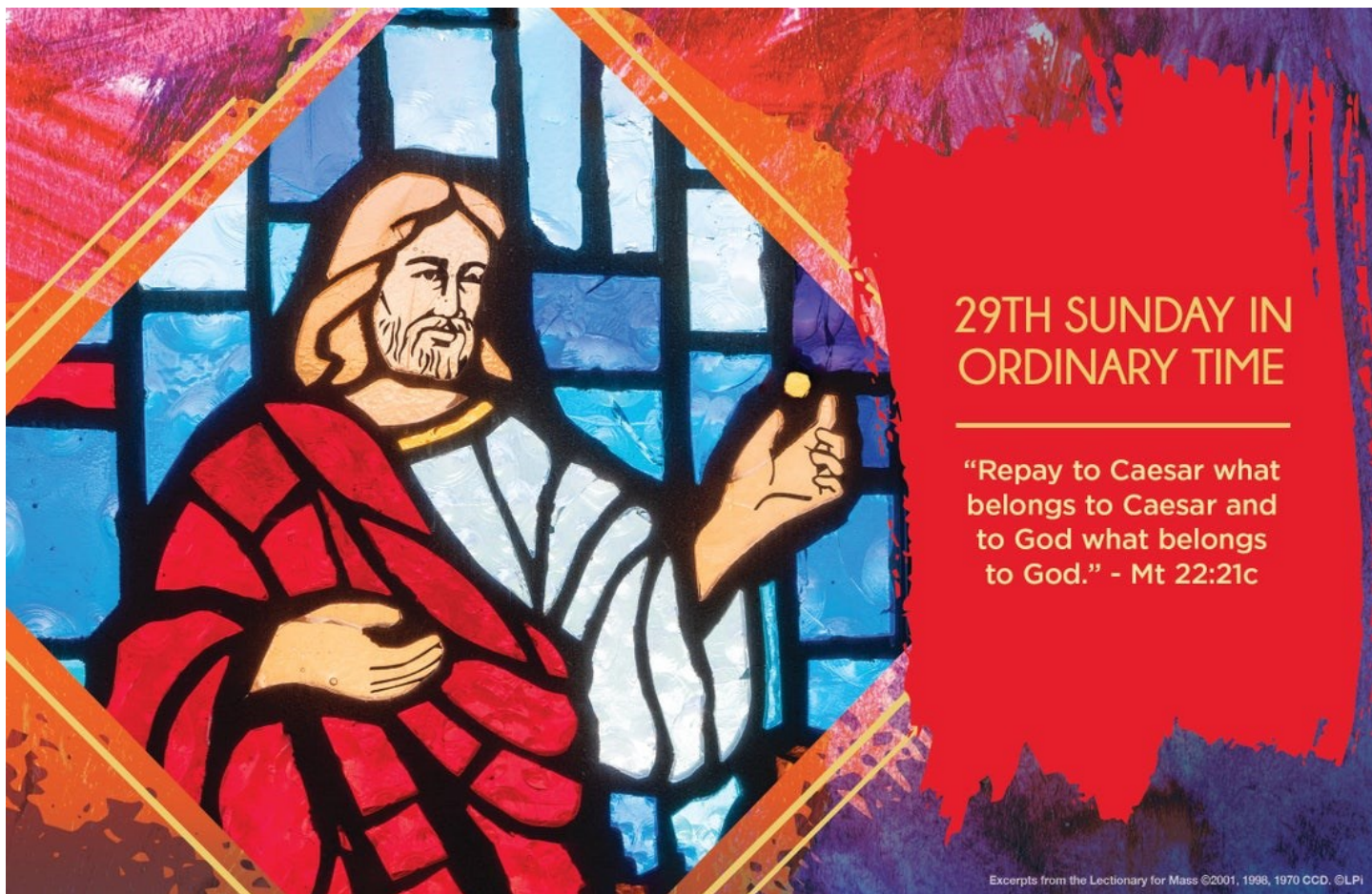

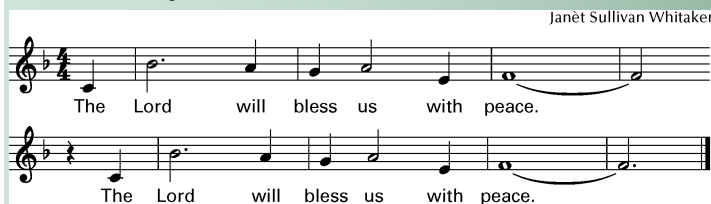

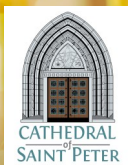
### Vocations
