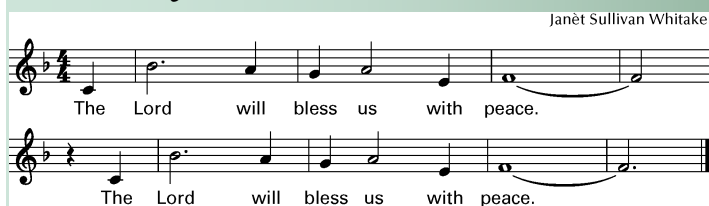

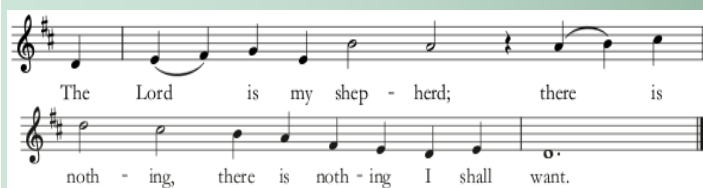

Vocation Raffle

Each year the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council has supported vocations to religious life through its Faith in Action program "RSVP" – the Refund Support Vocations Program.
