



November is Palliative and Hospice Care Month

We celebrate those who care for the disabled and the sick We educate ourselves about Physician Assisted Suicide

The Catholic Church supports palliative and hospice care in the face of growing legalization of euthanasia and assisted suicide around the world. What are these terms?

- <u>Palliative Care:</u> Relieves the pain, symptoms and stress of a serious illness while working with primary, curative care. Anyone can receive palliative care for any duration, usually in the form of pain management, and is usually covered by insurance.
- Hospice Care: Focuses on the pain, symptoms, and stress of a serious illness during its terminal phase, usually considered when the burden of curative treatment outweighs any benefit.
- **Euthanasia:** One person intentionally acts to end the life of another person who is deemed to be suffering, can be passive (withhold food or water) or active (injection of lethal drugs). Most of Canada's "assisted suicide" deaths are actually euthanasia.
- <u>Physician Assisted Suicide:</u> A health care provider assists the patient in acquiring the prescription to commit suicide, but does not personally administer the means of death.

What does the Catholic Church support?

CCC 2276: Those whose lives are diminished or weakened deserve special respect. Sick or handicapped persons should be helped to lead lives as normal as possible.

CCC 2277: Whatever its motives and means, direct euthanasia consists in putting an end to the lives of handicapped, sick, or dying persons. It is morally unacceptable.

CCC 2279: Even if death is thought to be imminent, the ordinary care owed to a sick person cannot be legitimately interrupted ... Palliative care is a special form of disinterested charity. As such it should be encouraged.
