

Mom was the school and parish secretary in Salem for over 15 years. She and Dad chaired the Summerfest at St. Theresa for years. She loved the Church and taught that same love to all of us. She wanted others to appreciate the beauty she saw in the Church. My dad's dementia is worsening quickly. I'd be very glad for prayers for him. And am I ever glad that I was invited by Bishop McGovern 18 months ago to be here, closer to them. It was a long, arduous trek, but what an honor to walk the path beside her. Years ago, as Dad wheeled her to her room at the nursing home, after having a particularly rough evening of worry, she sat up a little in her wheelchair, and like a child, waved to us. That's how I see her now, sweetly waving to us as she had to move on. But she is set free. She is at peace. Thanks be to God.






Pregnancy Care Center Donations Needed


