

From Fr. Godfrey

ADVENT. Today begins the season of Advent. This year, we have a mere twenty-two days to prepare ourselves for the birth of the Savior. As we try to make that happen, maybe there are some lessons we can learn from other parts of life. Our Christmas shopping might give us reason to reflect on our ability to be generous.

Christmas is a time when **generosity** seems to reach its zenith. It proves to us that we can be generous, beautifully so. How about a five-minute drive without the radio or phone to reflect on who merits our generosity and who doesn't, what gifts I'm willing to share and which I'm not? The example of the King of kings is simple: give all that we can for the good of all. We'll also be singing Advent songs, which tap into the darkness of this month: the days are becoming shorter. In the chant of the Church, we use lots of Gregorian Mode 4 in Advent, which has a mixed emotion: hopeful but concerned. Much of the Advent music works the same: we must be people of hope, but the darkness threatens. Christ will conquer, to be sure! What worries do I hold which Christ might enlighten, lift, and help me release? Over time, the trees go up and the rest of the **decorations**: a reminder of the festivity for which we plan. They remind us: rarely do great things happen without careful preparation. Decorating the tree, buying the food, making travel arrangements and plans for meals – it's all preparation and reminds us again of a skill we already have: joyful preparation. This Advent, I urge us all to examine our generosity, to sing or pray with hope, and to prepare for the coming of our King – who came in the flesh, comes to us in Word and Sacrament, and will come again in glory.

ADVENT RESOURCES. Please feel free to take a copy of the little booklet I prepared: "Our Daily Prayers." There is a brief psalm that can start out our days during Advent (called the Invitatory), and night prayer, which can help us rest under the protection of the Most High. I hope it's helpful. **DECEMBER 8: HOLY DAY OF OBLIGATION.** Masses for the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception – December 7 & 8, are listed elsewhere in the bulletin. Please do make the effort to celebrate our Blessed Mother, the patroness of the Americas.
