



From Fr. Godfrey

- **ADVENT**. I hope that this season of Advent has afforded us all a few moments of silence, of quiet preparation, of spiritual hospitality for the Christ-child. In our hectic lives, sometimes silence is a perfect stranger, but it is in the peaceful quiet, even in fleeting moments, that we can best hear that still, small voice of the Lord, calling us to peace. "Graciously grant peace in our days, that ... we may always be free from sin and safe from all distress as we await...." We hear these words at every Mass. Peace comes from removal of sin and distress. Advent is all about waiting for the One who provides the forgiveness of our sins. His presence should aid us in living without distress. As Advent rushes forth into the Birthday of Christ, let's ask for the wisdom we need to look for Him who forgives us and brings us peace. We can generally know the powerful peace of the Christ-child. Let's be grateful for that peace. So many in the world long for it, but do not find it. How blessed we are.
- MONTH'S MIND. My mother died November 8, so it's already been over a month. In the monastery, we have the tradition of remembering our deceased confreres on their 30th day after death, and on the year anniversary. Remembering those who have gone before us is a valuable gift. My sister who died drove a Ford Flex. When I see a Ford Flex, I pray, "Eternal rest, grant unto her, O Lord...." Last week, while with Dad, I said, "We'll pray that prayer for Mom when we see a yellow car" yellow was her favorite color. Remembering is bittersweet, but it is a Christian virtue to hallow the dead. May they all rest in peace.



offers an engaging, practical reflection.




We gaze upon the Jesse Tree each Sunday, as it adorns our beautiful South Nave stained glass depiction of God's plan for our salvation. This enlightening program is
