



From Fr. Godfrey

- **NEW YEAR**. As we are only a few days into the new year, I hope we are all still celebrating this wonderful season of Christmas, which doesn't end till sundown on Monday, January 8, the feast of the Baptism of the Lord. This season in which we find ourselves teaches us of our future: joyful expectation of Christ's coming is always fulfilled, in

ways we expect (the manger) and in surprising ways (the most meaningful moments of last weekend). He will come again in glory! May the true Spirit of Christmas, the presence of Christ, animate and sustain us during this whole new year.

- **DEDICATION ANNIVERSARY**. On Monday, the whole Church will celebrate the Baptism of the Lord except us at the Cathedral. It's the Solemnity of the Anniversary of the Dedication of the Cathedral. Even if you can't make the 6:45AM Mass that day, I encourage you to celebrate this important day in the life of our parish!
- THANK YOU to everyone who was so kind to me and to the parish during this Christmas season. There is great generosity in this wonderful place! Thanks also to all who took part in decorating, cleaning, practicing and preparing readings and music, the sacristans, and all who have helped! Lovely!
- RESOLUTIONS. Again, as we work on new years' resolutions, I encourage us all to focus on the four basic areas of discipleship: hospitality, prayer, formation, service. If we're working on progress in those areas, we'll be closer to Christ and more compassionate to one another! And while we're on the topic of resolutions, Ash Wednesday is February 14! Get ready.



IRA CONTRIBUTIONS

The Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD) is another means by which to contribute to your Parish. A QCD is a direct transfer of funds from your IRA, payable directly to a qualified charity, as described in the QCD provision in the Internal Revenue Code. Amounts distributed as a QCD can be counted toward satisfying your RMD for the year, up to \$100,000. The QCD is excluded from your taxable income.

Funds must be transferred directly from your IRA custodian to the qualified charity. This is accomplished by requesting your IRA custodian to issue a check from your IRA payable to the charity. You can then request that the check be mailed directly to the charity, or forward the check to the charity yourself.

If this parish is your charity of choice, checks are to be made payable to St. Peter's Roman Catholic Cathedral.
