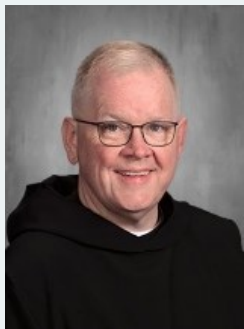

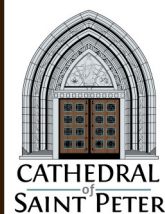


From Fr. Godfrey

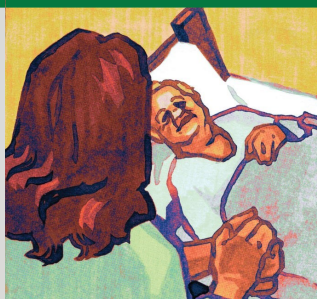
