



From Fr. Godfrey

enabling the diocese to carry out the work that is our responsibility according to the gospel: caring for the poor, serving those in need, educating our brothers and sisters, supporting those with hardship, providing the services of a local Church (like the Tribunal, the finance office, the office of Worship, and other offices of leadership and service). After 18 months in this diocese, it seems apparent to me that we do great work with the resources we have. Last year, your generosity to the CSMA exceeded our goal. What a blessing to so many people who benefit directly from that generosity! I encourage us all to continue to support the diocese's mission in this practical and effective way.






