



From Fr. Godfrey

Let's remember God's goodness to us and seek to be better disciples, better Christians, better Catholics.

"Early in my time in seminary, I was wandering down a hallway – about the most mundane place in the whole campus – when I had an epiphany. I had just heard a conference on the sacrificial nature of the priesthood, and at that time in my discernment, my chief struggle was the sacrifice of celibacy. Had an acute, daily awareness of my desire for a family of my own. There in the hallway, it struck me that if the life of the priest is one of sacrifice for God's people, what better sacrifice could a man offer than his greatest human desire? From there, discernment became a bit easier. I could see this sacrifice as a gift... I wasn't excited about it, but I could see the good of the sacrifice in God's plan for me. In my many experiences as a priest, some heavenly, some mundane, I've been frequently aware of a consequence of that epiphany – joy."
