From Fr. Godfrey

- **EASTER!!** We are still in the first half of the Easter Season. And the fifty days of Easter may just call us to conversion as much as Lent. It's not our custom to give up things for Easter, but I would like to make some proposals. For Easter this year, let's give up being passive spectators at Mass and participate in the work of the Church.

How about giving up holding on to the harsh words of the grade school music teacher, if we heard them, and sing with the voice God gave us? Why not give up any fears we have about the Church, the embodiment of the merciful Christ? How about giving up holding back on the reluctance we might have to share more freely the beautiful gifts God has given us? Let's embrace the new life God has given us through the resurrection of Jesus. As we celebrate weddings, first Holy Communion, graduations, and all sorts of other joyful elements of our life of faith and hope, let's take as our own the new life in Christ, the Risen Lord. Even with inevitable disappointment or sadness in our lives, we know the words: it is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord.

- **GRUMPY PASTOR.** Last weekend, some of you saw what happens when your pastor can't sleep for a week because of allergies. I try not to be crabby even in such circumstances. Personal revelation: even after 35 years of monastic life, mornings are still tough for me. (They told me I'd get used to mornings - morning prayer at the monastery is 5:30 - and that was a lie!) I rely on your active participation in the liturgy to help me make the best of that. The more you can come ready to truly celebrate God's goodness, the more certainly I'll be able to do the work you expect of me too. Thanks for your understanding.

- **THANK YOU** to all who catechize our students in preparation for First Holy Communion, those who organize and take part in the fundraisers for our school and parish, those whose kindness is humbling to me, those who show exemplary hospitality to our guests and visitors.

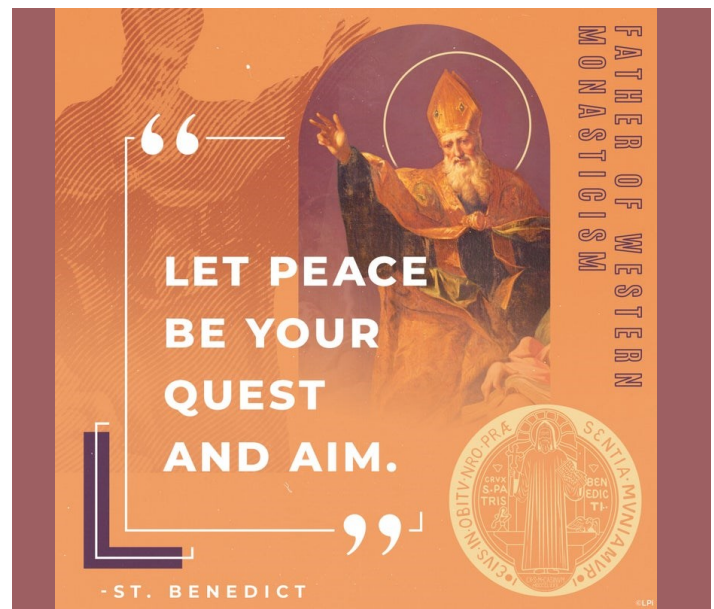

“A monastery is a place where God is sought. Yet, I have always been terrible at seeking. As a boy, I even once forgot to look for my grandmother in a game of hide-and-seek. When I first visited St. Benedict Abbey as a college student in 2013, I heard a call from Christ that I didn’t really understand at the time. I loved the liturgy, the fraternity, the whole daily life – but I couldn’t explain why I wanted to be here. I believe our Lord called me to seek him in the monastery by my prayer and work, and by charity to my brothers and our guests, ultimately to find him in eternity. Christ sometimes seems to hide himself and call out so that I will seek him more eagerly, but often he is simply hidden by my distractions. Despite my forgetfulness, I am encouraged by his constant reminders and his promise: “Seek and you will find” (Mt 7:7)”

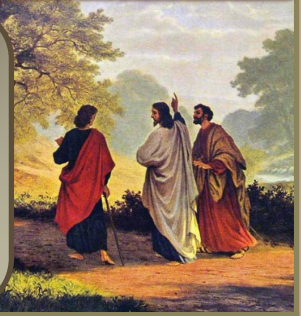

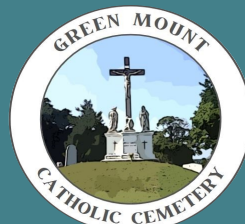
