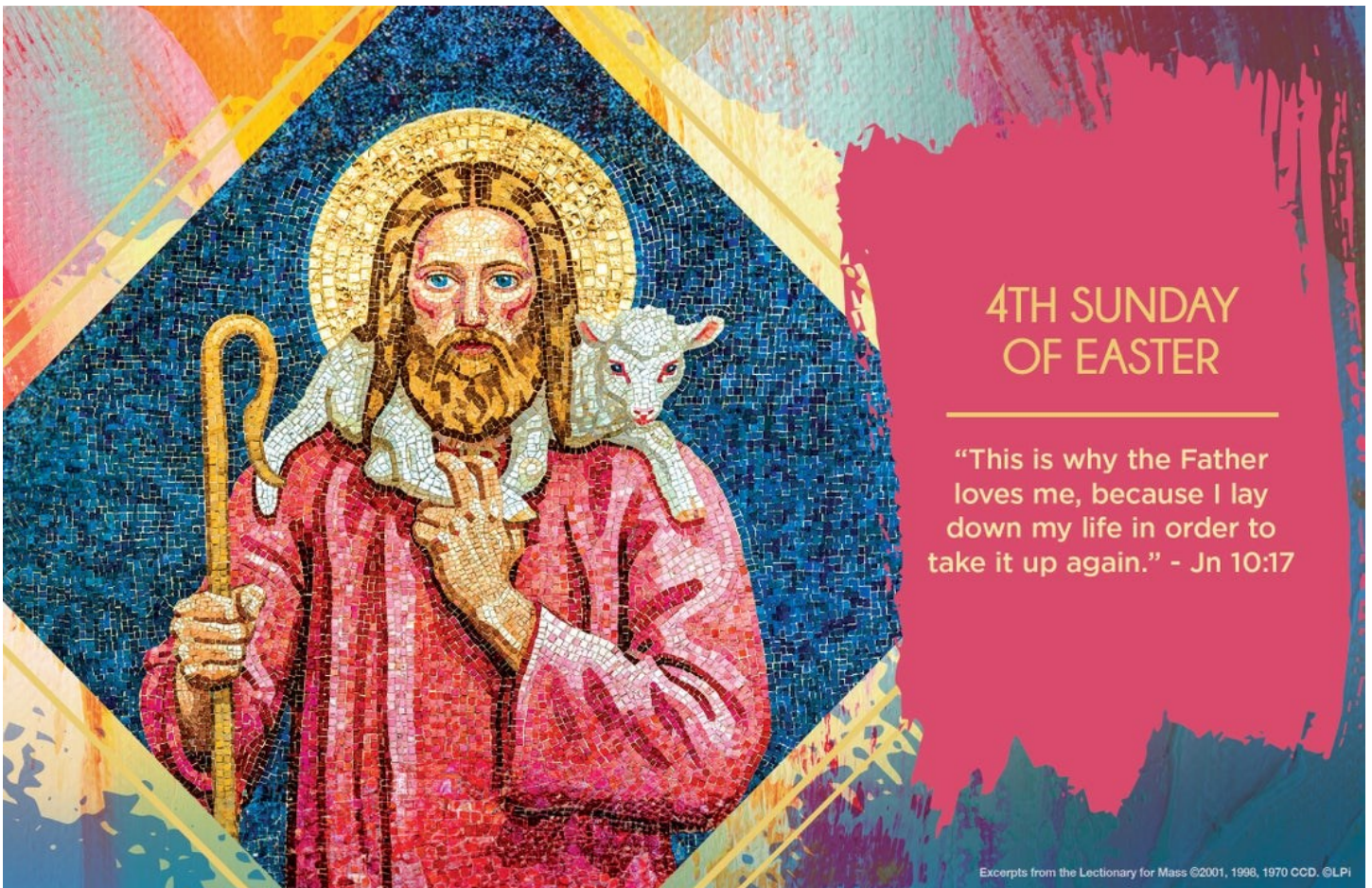

- **EASTER.** We keep hearing Jesus say in the Gospel those merciful words: **Peace be with you.** What if those words are addressed to each of us as well? In the tricky relationships of our lives, in the difficult situations we have to maneuver at work, in our daily challenges, what if Jesus is speaking those words to us?

It's certainly not magic, but instead of obsessive worry, maybe we should pray and do our best to accept the gift of peace, Christ's amazing gift to us. God knows our world needs it, and so do we!

- **CONFIRMATION.** May the great gifts of the Holy Spirit come down in abundance upon our eighth graders as they are confirmed in faith this weekend. Those gifts will stay with you, brothers and sisters. Receive them deeply and allow them to lead you well into your future in the Church. We rejoice with you; we need your good gifts.

- **JOY.** As we celebrate First Holy Communion and the other sacraments, there is such reason for us to rejoice during this beautiful Easter Season. The eager face of the second grader receiving the Body of Christ or the giddy bride and groom exchanging their vows: cause for joy. Let's all see the joy of the resurrection in our lives. And then, let's work to let that show in our bearing.

- **STEWARDSHIP.** One of the basic tenets of stewardship is this: as baptized Christians, we are DISCIPLES of Jesus Christ. Disciples follow the Master joyfully, doing as much as possible exactly what He did and does. Disciples then begin to realize just how GIFTED we are: God is so good to us in so many ways! Gifted, we rightly become GRATEFUL. It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere, to give God thanks. 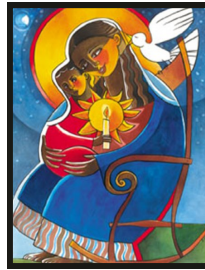

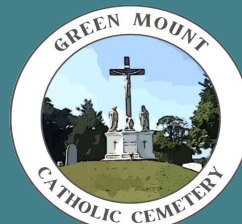
