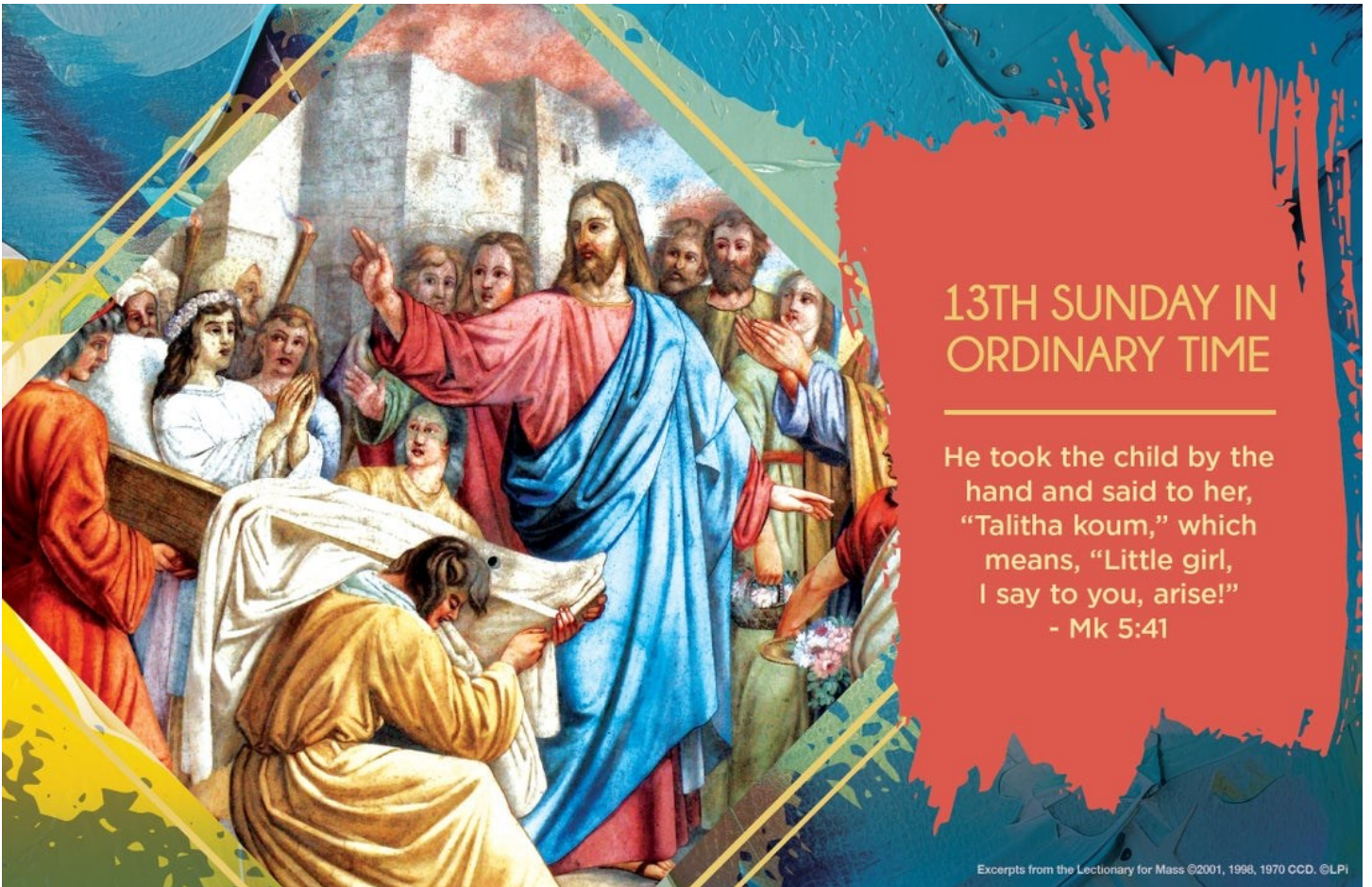

From Fr. Godfrey

How do I learn to welcome Jesus and participate more fully in the Eucharist? Books have been written on the topic, but I'd like to offer just one of many possible simple suggestions. In the monastic tradition, we have a practice called *lectio divina* – Latin for “holy reading.” *Lectio* can show us the way to discipleship. There are four steps or stages of *lectio*: reading (usually scripture), meditation (invested reflection on the reading), contemplation (resting in the presence of Christ), and prayer (turning our reflection and “visit” into a conversation with God). Each of these requires the person to **invest** time and effort. Each requires the presumption that **I have something to gain by spending time with Christ**. Each requires **longing** for something I don't currently have. Each requires developing a **real relationship**. As Pope Benedict XVI wrote: Today there is a need to rediscover that Jesus Christ is not just a private conviction or an abstract idea, but a **real person**, whose becoming part of human history is capable of renewing the life of every man and woman (*Sacramentum Caritatis* 77). Christ wants our lives to be good, truly good, holy, just, and inspired. We might look toward a simple question to grow in our love for Christ in the Eucharist: **Who does Christ invite me to become?** And then, the follow-up is so much more difficult: Will I allow myself to become the person He intends?

— **BRIEF REMINDER:** The four pillars of stewardship are **Hospitality, Prayer, Formation, & Service**. The three areas of stewardship are **Time** (with God in prayer), **Talent, & Treasure**. The three foundations of stewardship are that disciples are **Gifted, Grateful,** and **Generous** for and with the gifts we have been given. All of these realities also call us to greater Eucharistic zeal and love for Christ. We might each choose one and begin earnest work on that in our lives.

RESPECT FOR LIFE

Dangers of the Abortion Pill

Chemical abortion is dangerous for women. From September 2000 through December 2022, the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) recorded 4,218 “adverse events” caused by the process— including the deaths of 32 women. Although the FDA stopped requiring reports of non-fatal adverse events in 2016, a combination of pre-2016 required reporting and post-2016 voluntary reporting also indicates serious non-fatal consequences. These include 1,049 non-fatal hospitalizations, 604 cases of blood loss requiring transfusions, 97 ectopic pregnancies, and 418 infections of which 75 were “severe.” These numbers are likely underestimates, because many adverse events are experienced at home and treated in emergency rooms, where they are often reported as related to miscarriages rather than to abortion pills.
