From Fr. Godfrey

— **EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL.** On this evening, **Sunday, July 7**, and the morning of **Monday, July 8**, we in Belleville will have a unique opportunity to take part in a national effort of Eucharistic piety. Sunday evening at the Shrine of Our Lady of the Snows, we will welcome the Eucharist, coming all the way from California, stopping diocese by diocese, for adoration and renewal. That evening, there will be Eucharistic Exposition (adoration), prayer, singing, witness talks, and other activities connecting us as a local Church to the Church throughout our country. Monday morning, there will be Mass at the Cathedral, before the Blessed Sacrament is taken to the Diocese of Springfield on the way to the National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis the following week. As more details are available, we will share them with you. I encourage your participation.

Even more, I hope that this event will be for the people of our parishes in the Diocese an opportunity to **renew our zeal for Christ present to us in the Eucharist.** I hope we set our vision on welcoming Christ more into our lives, as He feeds us with His sacred Body and Blood as the sustenance we need as His disciples. Sitting passively as Jesus walked by was not generally the activity recounted in the gospels. People who welcomed Him, responded to Him and approached Him and asked for His mercy: these are the people whose stories we can recount from memory. We will flourish as Christian disciples if we open our hearts and minds to the living Lord. How do we do that? More to come later regarding that question

— **PARISH STEWARDSHIP RETREAT.** Last weekend, I was giving an all-day Saturday Parish Stewardship Retreat and covering the weekend Masses in Kona, on the big island of Hawaii. I'll have left Belleville, God and United Airlines willing, Friday morning and returned home on Monday. **Also**, I'm planning to offer a retreat in the Fall for all three parishes (Cathedral, Blessed Sacrament, Queen of Peace) together to help keep us focused on this important part of living as disciples of Jesus.

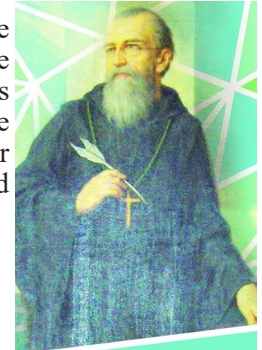

RESPECT FOR LIFE

The Law and New Risks of the Abortion Pill

Over the years, the FDA has bent the law and shown disregard for women's health when it comes to chemical abortion. Most recently, the FDA began allowing mifepristone to be prescribed through virtual doctor's visits, to be ordered online, and to be available at neighborhood pharmacies. This lack of safety standards puts women and girls at risk. Because they are less likely to go to a doctor's office and get an ultrasound, they may unknowingly have an ectopic pregnancy or be farther along in their pregnancy than they realize. It is very dangerous to the woman to take abortion pills in either of these circumstances. In addition, allowing access to the pills through virtual appointments and online orders may be exploited by violent partners and human traffickers.
