From Fr. Godfrey

— **EUCCHARISTIC REVIVAL.** By the time you read this, the National Eucharistic Procession will have a week ago passed through our diocese. Whether we participated in any of those events or not, we can certainly ask ourselves whether we are making progress

toward great love for Christ in the Eucharist. Do I seek out **communion** with Him more frequently than a few years ago? Do I **rely** on His grace when making important decisions or when facing regular temptation? It's a blessing for ourselves and for those who are dear to us if we **open ourselves more readily to Christ** and **welcome Him more completely** into our lives. *Let us also pray for all who will gather in Indianapolis for the National Eucharistic Congress, July 17-21, 2024.*

— **DOORS.** In the past year, all three churches where I am pastor/rector have had the front church doors refurbished or completely replaced, first at Queen of Peace, then at Blessed Sacrament, and most recently at the Cathedral. We can all rejoice that the church buildings look better. But I believe this facelift must also lead us to creating more doors for people to come into our parish. In other words, we must also **welcome the stranger and the parishioner who has become invisible.** Often, parishes desire more people but don't think "externally." How do those who are not yet or not currently part of the parish see us? And how do they get in? Is there a friendly face to greet them? Or a closed door, albeit beautiful? Fling wide the portals!

Not everyone has time off, but we can all still strive to find some good time to connect with God and to relax in His presence.
