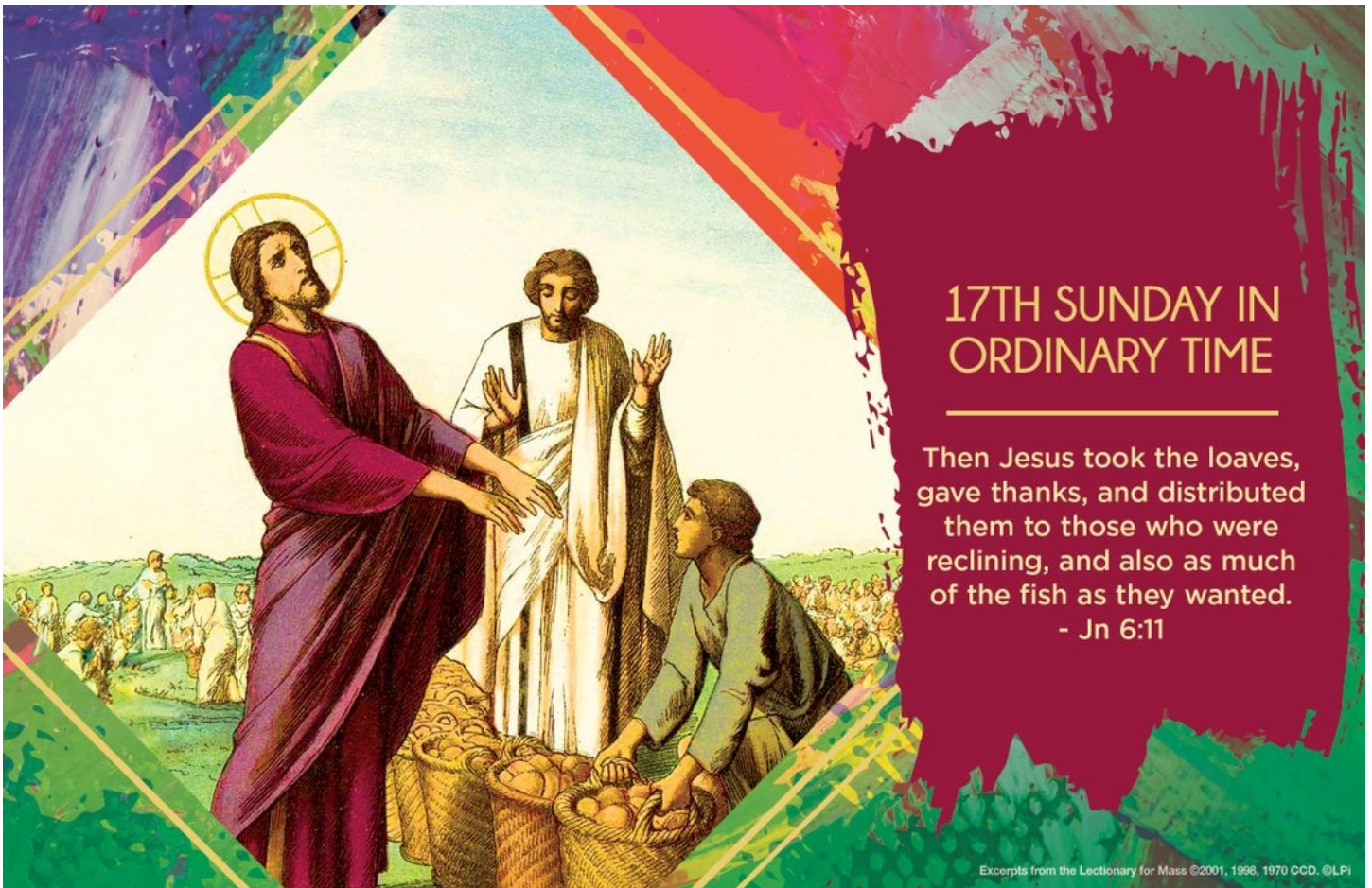

From Fr. Godfrey

— **RECEPTIVITY.** Now, the Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis is but a memory. Many went to Indianapolis – some estimates say more than 50,000. Others watched pieces of it online or on TV. Through these past three years, our goal has been to awaken parishioners to a greater receptivity for the Lord. When He speaks in the scriptures, when He feeds me with His Body and Blood, how willing am I to receive Him? He may very well be saying in His own amazing way, “Follow me.” How excited am I to do that? The more we pay attention to Christ and His commands, the more we will know Him. John 14:21: Whoever has my commandments and observes them is the one who loves me. And whoever loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and reveal myself to him.

— **DAD.** Many of you so nicely ask about my dad. This past Sunday afternoon, he had an odd episode where his knees buckled a few times as he was walking into someone’s home for dinner. He didn’t fall. We took him to the Emergency Department at St. Mary’s Hospital in Centralia which was just across the street, and they diagnosed a serious heart attack. As I write this, he’s been waiting for a bed at Barnes in St. Louis for a day and a half. Please pray for him as he recovers from his third heart attack! Thanks for your kindness.

— **HOSPITALITY.** A few small ways to offer kindness in hospitality at the parish. Parking: If I’m able to walk, maybe I could park a little farther from the door to allow others who struggle to park closer to the door. Pew ends. When I enter the pew, maybe I move more to the center to allow others who come after me to enter the pew easily. Helping with the names. Find a way to remind people of your name if they seem not to remember. For example, “I said to myself, Fr. Godfrey...”

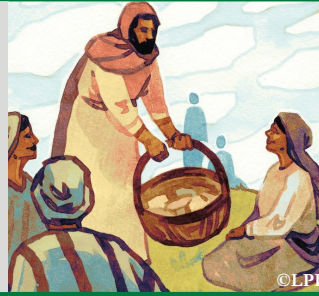



This group of men and women visit those who are homebound, sick, and elderly parishioners in their homes for prayer and personal contact.


