


PRAY AT All Times

PRAYER: CULTIVATING A DEEP RELATIONSHIP WITH CHRIST

Prayer is a gift given to us by God to grow in unity with Him. Prayer, as the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* states, "ought to animate us at every moment" (*CCC*, 2697). If we live our day-to-day lives in continuous prayer, then we will deepen our relationship with God and unite ourselves more fully to Him. Yet, "we tend to forget him who is our life and our all...we cannot pray 'at all times' if we do not pray at specific times, consciously willing it" (*CCC*, 2697). To remember God throughout our day, we must first cultivate a prayer life at special times.

We become good stewards of our time when we intentionally devote time for God. It is through this time spent in prayer that we will encounter God and develop an intimate relationship with Him. We will become more attentive to God's voice in our lives which will help us become good stewards of all that God has given us. During this year's Stewardship Renewal, our parish is focusing on prayer and how each parishioner can grow in his or her prayer life.



STEWARDSHIP OF TIME

DEEPENING A PRAYER LIFE

Forming and maintaining a prayer life takes work, persistence, and sacrifice. We go through seasons when prayer seems easy; or when we struggle to find the time, or we have the time but lack the desire to pray. It is in each of these moments that we must willingly choose to pray out of love for God. The results will be greater than you could ever imagine!

Consider these suggestions to begin, or strengthen, your prayer life:

- Begin each morning with prayer, inviting God to be a part of your day. Consider a Morning Offering, the daily Mass readings, or a decade of the Rosary.
- Prayer is taught in the home. Pray as a family each night before bed. Give each member an opportunity to say an intention, and conclude with an *Our Father*, *Hail Mary*, and *Glory Be*.
- Seek out time in front of the Blessed Sacrament. The more time you spend with the Lord, the more you will be attentive to His voice in your life.
- We are constantly consumed with the internet, phones, and TV. Take one of the opportunities you have for screen time and instead spend it in prayer.

In addition to setting aside time to pray in quiet with our Lord, there are opportunities throughout our day that lend themselves to further prayer. It becomes much more effective and meaningful when it's tied to a part of daily life. Reflect on your day and consider situations that prayer can become a part of such as the morning and evening commute or waiting in line at the store. It is in these moments that you can talk with God, pray for someone, or examine your day. In just a short time, prayer will become an integral component of your daily life.







STEWARDSHIP OF TALENT

PRAYERFUL SERVICE

Our actions become prayerful when we share our gifts and talents for the glory of God. Offering our work and service for God and with God can make it a prayer — whether it be your job, cleaning the house, folding laundry, or making meals. Serving our family, a neighbor, our parish community, or anyone we encounter can become a form of prayer — a moment when we encounter Christ Himself.

Read through the ministries in our Handbook and discern which methods of service align most closely with your individual talents and gifts.

- Are you a natural-born public speaker? Consider becoming a lector and participate in a meaningful way in the celebration of Mass, the Church's most important prayer.
- Are you a compassionate person? Join a prayer ministry at our parish, praying for the intentions of those in our parish and community.
- God is calling each of us to use our gifts and talents in a unique way. Offer each task or act of service to God so that it may be done with the heart of a servant.

STEWARDSHIP OF TREASURE

PRAYERFUL GIVING

Every moment of our lives is an opportunity to grow in our relationship with Christ. Prayer is the best way to do that. Even mundane tasks, or things that seem to have no connection to God, can be approached with a prayerful heart. Our treasure is a great example of this idea.

We should approach everything in life — even our finances — with Christ in mind. How can we use our treasure to give glory to God? Does our monthly budget reveal areas of our lives that need adjusting? Has money become an idol? During this year's Stewardship Renewal, prayerfully consider how God is calling you to share your treasure.

Like every gift God gives to us, our finances come with responsibility. We are called to use our money wisely and in ways that reflect our love for Christ. And when we live our lives generously, we find joy, peace, and contentment. At The Cathedral of St. Peter, we invite all parishioners to support the Church according to the scriptural tithe:


